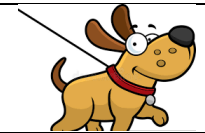

MEDICATION

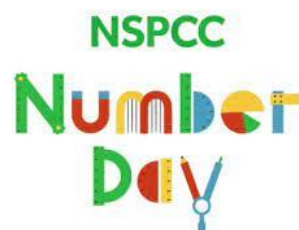
