

LOCAL COUNCIL AWARD SCHEME FOUNDATION

#### Local Elections May 1<sup>st</sup> 2025

By the time you read this you will hopefully all be aware of the upcoming local elections on May 1st. This year, there will be elections at the Unitary level, i.e. Shropshire County Council, and at the Town and Parish Council Level. The deadline for nominations is 4pm on April 2<sup>nd</sup>, so I expect most candidates will have already submitted their nomination forms by the time this newsletter reaches you.

#### Other important dates to be aware of

- From 14<sup>th</sup> March poll cards will be delivered to registered voters
- 5pm on 11.04.2025 deadline to register to vote in the May elections
- 5pm on 14.04.2025 deadline to apply for postal vote, or postal proxy vote
- 5pm on 23.04.2025 deadline to apply to vote by proxy (NOT postal proxy)
- 5pm on 23.04.2025 deadline to apply for Voter Authority Certificate (VAC) if you don't have an acceptable form of photo ID
- 01.05.2025 Polling day! Remember to bring your photo ID or VAC. You won't be allowed to vote without ID

#### **Pre-election period**

For the 6 weeks prior to an election we will be in the Pre-election period (which used to be known as "purdah"). Council work can continue during this time, but we are not allowed to give any publicity to any Councillors' campaigns. We can continue to update you via the newsletter, but the info must be about local issues and a-political, and we have to be careful not to publish anything on controversial issues, or seek to influence voters in any way. So please bear that in mind when reading this newsletter update!

#### Shropshire Local Plan to be withdrawn

Shropshire Council had prepared a project plan to address Planning Inspectors concerns with the Local Plan within a timeframe of six months. The Planning Inspectors have since concluded that the necessary work cannot be completed within six months, and have therefore recommended the withdrawal of the Local Plan. On 6<sup>th</sup> March 2025, Shropshire Council announced via its Newsroom website that the Local Plan would be withdrawn and the Council would instead focus on preparing a Plan for the period of 2025-45. More updates will be shared as they become available.

#### New Councillor email addresses

In addition to our new gov.uk website (**www.clive-pc.gov.uk**) Clive parish Councillors are now using gov.uk email addresses. As we are in the pre-election period, we can't promote individual Cllrs, but should you need to reach anyone on the Council.

#### Parish Council Budget and Council tax 2025-26

The budget for 2025-26 was finalised at the Council meeting in Jan 2025, and is available on the Finance page of the PC website. The Council also agreed a precept of £19,326, a 9.7% increase on last year's precept. This equates to a band D council tax equivalent of £77.58 (for the Parish Council's portion of Council tax), which is an increase of £6.54 or 9.2% from last year. This increase is needed to cover increased national insurance contributions, as well as additional funds to the Renshaw's Field Association for tree maintenance costs.

## Grinshill Parish Council March 2025 updates and more.

The Parish Council held its regular bi-monthly meeting as normal at Grinshill Village Hall 7pm on the 3rd March 2025. This article will highlight a number of

actions the Parish are following through with partners.





#### **1. Parish Council Information:**

The Parish Council continues to engage at a series of levels on behalf of Parishioners with a number of partners to improve the local area. The main partners are Shropshire Council with whom the Parish Council continues to have dialogue about the 511 provision of public transport and how that can better serve the village. RAF Shawbury also continues to be engaged both in terms of their own night flying details, policies on drones and the high vis campaigns for horse riders. Also as part of this dialogue the trainees from the base continue to help out on environmental projects particularly within Corbet Wood on the steps project and wetlands project. The Parish Council also lobbies the Local Police Neighbourhood Teams based at Wem in terms of the speed of the traffic along High Street which causes concerns at different times during the day. A strong request has been made for the Police to undertake targeted work during those times – so speeders watch out!

#### 2. Public Rights of Way Project:

Members of the Parish Council are working with Shropshire Council to 'walk' 'report' and 'repair' local rights of ways (ROW) across Grinshill. Any Parishioners wishing to get involved please contact the Clerk on the details set out below if they would like to be involved in this project.

3. IMPORTANT NOTICE: Local Parish Council elections 1<sup>st</sup> May 2025 – your support is needed now more than ever to help the Parish Council function over the next four years. Over the last 12 months the Parish Council has only been functioning at 50% of it's capacity with only four Parish Councillors out of eight. This notice is therefore a call to Parishioners interested in helping out within their community to step forward to stand in the 1st May 2025 local elections for Grinshill Parish Council. #### 4. Community Hub and Village Hall update:

The subjects of the shelving of the Community Hub project at present until others come forward in the future to develop it and initial work on the extension of the lease at the Village Hall were raised at the last Parish Council meeting. These two projects will therefore form the basis of the Parishioners meeting on **Monday 12<sup>th</sup> May 2025, 7pm at Grinshill Village Hall** for Parishioners to raise any further comments as the new Parish Council sets out on it's work for the next four years.

#### 5. Preparing for Emergencies – Community Resilience:

The Parish Council has prepared a short leaflet for Parishioners in terms of emergencies. This information is attached to this article and should be kept ready and accessible in safe place in case it is needed in future emergencies in the parish.

## **Grinshill Parish Council**

The Parish Council has been encouraged by other authorities from across Shropshire to consider preparing their communities for emergencies – but what could this mean for individual households within Grinshill? Our first message is that neighbours need to look out for one another particularly if you are aware of older people living close by on their own who may require a little bit more help from time to time when things happen or change.

This leaflet has therefore been split into a series of headings which the Parish Council hopes are helpful – you may consider keeping it in a safe place in case of emergencies.

Fire prevention and safety: If there is a fire, get out, stay out, call 999.

The emergency services are trained for a wide range of emergency situations. However, there is a lot you can do for example. Fit a smoke alarm, make an action plan so everyone knows how to escape in the event of a fire, take care when cooking, never leave lit candles unattended, ensure cigarettes are stubbed out and disposed of carefully, never smoke in bed, keep matches and lighters away from children, have your chimney swept regularly.

The next period commences on 31 March and is planned to 15 May. Night flying periods are usually for seven weeks with three weeks in between periods. There will be posts on the RAF Shawbury Facebook/Twitter advising on the night flying periods and we are grateful for the tolerance of this essential training. There is also information on the RAF Shawbury webpage with contact details for complaints or concerns. Night flying will commence typically 30 mins after sunset and may continue until 02:30.

The latest Helicopter Liaison Group Newsletter (No1 of 2025) has been issued and should be distributed to all Shropshire and Telford and Wrekin Town and Parish Councils. There are options for regional groups to be addressed by appropriate RAF Shawbury executives if warranted.

#### Airfield Works Programme

The airfields work programme is progressing well. These works will maintain the airfield operating surfaces for many more years to ensure our flying training continues. Where possible the main Contractor is sub-contracting local companies to bring benefit to the local area and lower the carbon footprint wherever possible.

### **Renshaw's Field Association**

Ten years on...2015 - 2025

**2015:** The field was purchased by Clive Parish Council on behalf of the community of Clive through a public works loan along with a small donation from Grinshill Parish Council.

**Renshaw's Field Association** was established to protect the field from development and maintain it as a recreational space for the benefit of the whole community. The association is an independent charitable trust made up of trustees who are either volunteers or representatives of local organisations, including the Parish Council, Village Hall, School, and Church.

- 2016: Planning permission was sought to change the access way to a splayed drive with grants from the Wrekin Housing Trust and Big Lottery Award.
  Clive & Grinshill WI donated funds to install a pedestrian gate, noticeboard, rubbish bin, and benches.
- **2022:** A 3m Willow Dome & Tunnel was purchased and planted with a grant from Community Resourcing and the Twemlows Community Energy Fund.
- **2023:** The Drawwell Wall Reinforcement & Rebuild Project was funded by a grant from the Big Lottery Fund and a donation from Clive Parish Council. Don Trow retired from the ground maintenance of the field. Adam Page steps up to the task.

A community event was held to plant trees and hedging (donated by The Woodland Trust) for The Queen's Green Canopy in January 2023. This event was commemorated by plaques inset in Grinshill stone.

**2024:** Two new picnic benches were installed with support from grants from Community Resourcing, the Twemlows Community Energy Fund, and Freedom Fibre.

On 7th December, Storm Darragh changed the landscape of the field as tree T2 fell. Unfortunately, property was damaged, but thankfully no people were harmed.

WI members also join with five other local groups to play skittles, kurling, darts, craft workshops and social evenings.


At County level there are several events each month designed to inspire, educate and entertain women of all ages and help make our communities a better place for everyone.



### **Grinshill Village Hall Report**

At recent meetings of the Management Committee, we have been considering a number of important issues.

#### The Lease

The current lease with the Sansaw Estate is due to end in December 2027. The lease is held by the Parish Council, and the management committee is tasked with the day to day running of the Hall. An initial meeting has been held with a representative of the Estate to discuss the potential renewal of the lease.

#### Finance

In common with similar organisations, GVH has been faced with significant increases in costs, particularly utilities, such as; electricity, water, and heating fuel. This has not been matched by increases in our income. The treasurer has presented a recent report that identified, in the last calendar year, there was a very significant shortfall of approximately £3000. Whilst this, in the short term can be covered from our positive bank balance, it is not sustainable, and needs to be addressed immediately. The committee have agreed a two year period to make every effort towards a break even budget.

Apart from the expenditure issues, we now receive very little income from use of the Hall by others, and surpluses from activities and events we put on. Therefore for a sustainable future, significant increases in our income are critical.

#### **Committee Members/Volunteers**

Recently we have managed to recruit some new members to the committee, and their contributions have been extremely positive, and helpful. However, the organisation of events, and day to day running still rests with a relatively small group of committee members and volunteers. In many cases, these people have been involved for many years. We feel that the only way for this to be sustainable in the long term, is for more practical involvement and support from the wider local community.

#### The Way Forward

We welcome contributions/comments from all villagers. Our meetings are open to all, so please come along if you have the time. If necessary, we would be very happy to organise an open village meeting at a weekend for a more general discussion. You can contact any committee member (including me -see below).





#### <u>Clive CE Primary School – Inspection</u> News

In the last edition of the Newsletter it was reported that OFSTED inspectors



had visited the school to monitor standards. The final report arrived just a little too late for us to tweak the school's contribution in the February/March newsletter. However, we are pleased to report that the inspectors found that the school "has taken effective action to maintain the standards identified at the previous inspection". In July 2018, the school was judged to be 'Good'. The latest inspection was what is termed an 'ungraded inspection' so no overall one-word judgement is given. Nevertheless, maintaining standards is something we are proud of.

The inspection process itself consisted of two inspectors interviewing senior leaders (Mrs Watts and Miss Brayford), teaching and support staff, parents and children as well as observation of books, analysis of data and brief observations of lessons and worship. They triangulate what they are told with what they see on the day and what the data show. If the three areas match, they can make that overall judgement. The day started off at 8am with the arrival of the inspectors. They left us at about 5pm after a full day of meetings, observations and talks with children.

The verbal feedback was extremely complimentary with the lead inspector making mention of some of the highlights he and his colleague experienced. It was a bit of a wait for the final report which didn't arrive until after the Christmas holiday but the overall findings were very good. The school is maintaining good standards in all areas. This was an ungraded inspection so they do not grade (Outstanding, Good, Requires Improvement or Inadequate) the school on the main OFSTED inspection areas -Personal Development, Quality of Education, Leadership & Management, Behaviour & Attitudes and EYFS. Nevertheless it is a very intense day for all involved.

The full report is available for anyone to read on our website (<u>Clive CofE Primary School: OFSTED</u>) or the OFSTED website (<u>Find an Ofsted inspection report</u>). Some key highlights for the school, however, are "Staff at this small school have high expectations for all pupils. They know each pupil and their needs well and ensure that all pupils are included in lessons. The school identifies the needs of pupils with SEND [Special Educational

Needs and Disabilities]. Staff adjust what they do so that these pupils can learn alongside others and achieve strong outcomes".

The four areas of an inspection are closely examined during the day. During their inspections, the inspectors found that the "school encourages pupils to use precise vocabulary to express

themselves and to explain their thinking. This approach begins in early years. For example, pupils can confidently describe the weather for the day. Children in



the Reception class can explain the relationship between numbers using words such as 'fewer' and 'more' ".



In considering behaviour and attitudes the inspection team judged that the "school has high expectations for behaviour and attendance. The school expects pupils to attend school every day and many pupils do" and that "caring staff in the early years teach children the importance of being kind and listening carefully. Pupils cooperate well and try their best".

Personal development is quite a broad area to inspect but we are pleased that the team found that the "school promotes pupils' personal development well. Pupils are knowledgeable about protected characteristics, diversity and discrimination".

Inspecting the fourth area of an inspection, the team judged that those "responsible for governance meet their statutory duties effectively. The multi-academy trust provides valuable support for the school. This includes.



for example, curriculum development and the sharing of expertise.


Governors bring helpful support and challenge from their local perspective. Staff are a caring, supportive team who are united in their dedication to the pupils' education. Staff are carefully supported in their workload and well-being".

Whilst we are very pleased with the inspection findings, we are not complacent in thinking that everything is 'great'. It is! But we are aware of areas that still need attention. The inspection team have asked us to consider more carefully assessment and developing the maths curriculum. We were already aware of these as points for development and they are already included within our annual School Development Plan.

We are very pleased with the overall findings and will continue to work hard to give the children who come into our care for 32.5 hours a week, 38 weeks a year, the best experiences that we can. As a staff team we are grateful for the support we receive from so many parents, governors, MAT teams and the local community. Clive CE Primary School is an important part of the village and we hope to remain so for many years to come.







**<u>5 regular children to welcoming 17 children</u>** through the door! 
